

Neighborhood Trees Surveyed

Northern Staten Island - Community Board 1

212 neighborhood trees were surveyed in the New Brighton/Livingston neighborhood of Staten Island. All of the trees are located in Community Board 1. Of the trees surveyed, 18 were in excellent condition, 176 in good condition, and 18 in poor condition. 64 of the trees are London plane tree (*Platanus x acerifolia*), 30 are Norway maple (*Acer platanoides*), and 11 are Silver maple (*Acer saccharinum*). The most valuable tree surveyed is an estimated 214 year old Tuliptree or Yellow-poplar (*Liriodendron tulipifera*) in excellent condition valued at \$23,069.00. The 2nd and 3rd most valuable trees are a 200 year old London plane tree (*Platanus x acerifolia*) and a 125 year old Pin oak (*Quercus palustris*) valued at \$22,109.00 and \$18,156.00 respectively and both in good condition.
